Fr David writes

This year, I feel that Advent has flown by very quickly. Coming back from a highly charged spiritual experience in the Holy Land, it took me some time to engage with the preparations for Christmas. I needed to take some breath to digest the experience, however the preparations for Christmas and simultaneously the renovation of the Presbytery took centre stage. The mystics, especially St Theresa of Avila, always envisaged the soul as a Mansion. And some psychologists find a direct connection between what is happening in the soul and our physical homes. My home became a metaphor for me

this year of my soul's desire for encountering Christ amidst the turmoil of transformation. Before there is order, there has to be chaos. I feel that we are ill-equipped to live in chaos. We prefer to have everything in order — everything under control. We are not good at the in-between stages. And yet what kept me going through the external turmoil of my home was the promise of a house in transformation. The promise of some normality at the end of the journey. Another aspect of resource in this process was the goodness of so many people wanting to make things nice for me. I will be always ever grateful for your love and concern.

The time just before Christmas is characterized by our desire for connection and relationship with one another. Christmas, I feel, brings the best in humanity. For a while people seem to become friendlier and want to help others especially those who are less fortunate than them. At Christmas, I experience people going out of their way in order to see smiles on other people's faces. Christmas is also a time where people acknowledge their blessings too and so want to make other people happier. Some of you are preparing homes to receive guests, others are preparing meals, and many are doing both. Still others are setting out on their travels to see loved ones during these holy days. We are really busy with so many tasks and charities. Amidst all of these activities are people who this year are dreading Christmas. These are the people who do not have the energy or even the will to celebrate because for the first time in their lives, a loved one is not with them this year. Some of us, in our parish are going through the pain of loss this Christmas. So although it is right to celebrate the gift of life during this time, we need to be sensitive and remember this reality too.

In the beautiful gospel today we might imagine Mary and Elizabeth sharing these feelings in this reading from Luke. Our gospel today begins with a journey. Mary, having heard from the angel Gabriel of Elizabeth's pregnancy, sets out to visit her kinswoman. This was no small expedition. Tradition holds that Zechariah and Elizabeth lived in Ain Karim, a little town in the hill country of Judea about five miles from Jerusalem. The Journey from Nazareth was nearly one hundred miles; travelling on foot or by caravan, it would have taken three to five days. We were blessed to have visited Ain Karim on our pilgrimage some weeks ago. It is not easy to get to however, I consider the place as one of my own personal highlights in the sense of the beauty of the landscape and also the sense of spirituality of the site. Not only did Mary believe the news Gabriel had brought her, but she puts this faith into action immediately travelling in haste to be close to Elizabeth and to share the good news that invites us all to "leap for joy". Mary visits her cousin and Elizabeth has certainly been preparing for her guest. The greeting and the encounter are joyful, and the evangelist Luke tells us that Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. For Luke the evangelist, the Holy Spirit is not only present and active in Jesus' ministry but before Jesus was born, in preparation for it.

This gospel passage calls to mind for us how important human relationships are. Amidst all the travel, preparation, meals and general business, the bonds of human love bind us together. When we consider the Christmas season, with its pressing demands, let us recall the ultimate reason for our cares and concerns. We have in mind those we love and care for. Ultimately that is what we yearn for and what gives us meaning in our lives. The richness of human relationships. Like Mary let us be more sensitive to the needs of those within our families who are feeling lonely, bereft and down. Let us invite, but at the same time be ready for a refusal of our offers. Let us try not to take this rejection personally. Let us give the other the option of acceptance and refusal. We cannot save the other from their pain however we can help them to realise that they can be themselves with us. They don't need to pretend. Encounters during Christmas season are multi-layered. Let us create places within our homes that allow others to be who they are. Let us take this opportunity this year to celebrate life – life as it is with all that gives us joy and all that which burdens us. My desire is that this Christmas would be a time where real love prevails. Merry Christmas to you and your families. Let us pray and care for one another.
