Fr David writes...

Part of the clinician's assessment of a patient is to ascertain whether the patient has a good support network or not. In moments of crisis we go through, some of us opt to isolate ourselves from others. This happens for self-preservation at times. This is a natural way of behaviour in order to come to terms with all the emotions we would be going through at the time. We desperately feel the need for our own space to make sense of the pain. We would lose our desire to socialise and we lack the energy to see people. The people who care about us, find this usually very upsetting. They feel that we are trying to push them out. However for some of us, it is the only way how we can cope in our pain. This is a normal way of behaviour for some time though. When isolation becomes habitual and is prolonged, mental health professions start to be concerned. Total isolation has its own dangers. And the ultimate fear of any clinician would be suicidal ideation or even worse committing suicide. Even in our desperate moments when we experience life to be totally futile and void, we need somehow to find the energy to reach out to some people we trust for support. Reaching out for support has in itself a taste of hope. It's refusing support that prevents us from moving forward and blocks us in a victim's mentality and self-pity. The feelings of helplessness that relatives feel when a loved one is reluctant to make the effort to reach out for help is indescribable.

The Gospel of Mark today introduces us to another character, Bartimaeus, the blind man. From the way Mark describes him, it's as if the reader or the early community would have known Bartimaeus as the blind man who sat begging on the road to Jericho. He definitely does not isolate him, wallowing in self-pity at home. He is out begging every day. Bartimaeus certainly had heard of Jesus, for upon learning that Jesus was on the road, Bartimaeus immediately cries out using the messianic title "Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me". He cries out to Jesus amidst the many other voices that day. He reached out for support. He wanted to express his need. His blindness did not hinder him from having a 'voice'. The people around him wanted to stop him from crying out. In their own way, those around him were telling him that he was not worth Jesus' attention and healing. He was considered unclean and sinful in his community. They wanted him to remain stuck in his illness.

However, the more they shouted at him to stop, Bartimaeus cried out louder. In Bartimaeus, we encounter a man who is persevering in his search for some cure – to see. And he put all his faith in this young Rabbi Jesus. It's as if nothing else matters but Jesus and the power he has. At this time, Jesus heard him cry and said, "Call him here". The people at this point changed their tune and encouraged him to go to Jesus. In an exchange reminiscent of Jesus's interaction with James and John last week, Jesus asks him, "What is it you want me to do for you?". James and John wanted to sit either side of Jesus in the kingdom. But Bartimaeus responds differently. He simply asks to see. He is not after power and entitlement, but he is after new sight. Jesus' response and Bartimaeus's healing is immediate and simultaneous. His sight is restored, and he follows Jesus.

He is now a true disciple, a follower of Jesus. And his faith response to Jesus is a model for us, perhaps even a better model than the brothers James and John. In Bartimaeus, we see a man who did not isolate himself because of his disability – he is empowered to search for healing and his faith provided him his desire to see. I would like to think today of all those within our parish who might be feeling hopeless in their pain. This is leading them to feelings of loneliness and depression. I pray that they would find in themselves the ability to reach out for help. To stop resisting support and engage with the professional mental health team in order to move forward. Cry out like Bartimaeus – persevere in your efforts to find a cure. Sometimes the first treatment does not work – do not loose heart. I pray that the right people and treatment will come your way. May God bless you all.
